

# NOTICE TO BAXLEY RESIDENTS

As of January 1, 2024, the City of Baxley Public Works Department will be adhering to the following yard debris and bulk pick up policy.

## **YARD DEBRIS PICK UP**

Yard Debris that meet the city size requirement (less than 5 ft long and less than 5 inches in diameter, loose, NOT BAGGED) will be picked up on a regular schedule each month. Debris that do not fit the size requirement WILL NOT be picked up. Tree removal services that cut down trees on private property are required to remove all debris associated with those trees.

**THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE NOT YARD DEBRIS AND WILL NOT BE PICKED UP** (could result in illegal dumping fine of \$100):

- Household trash, bagged trash, clothing
- Construction Debris (any debris created from the demolition, construction or remodeling of a structure)
- Tires
- Batteries
- Stumps
- Hazardous Materials
- Ashes
- Furniture and/or appliances (please see section on bulk items below)

## **BULK ITEMS**

What is a bulk item? – Bulk items are defined as furniture and/or appliances.

City Pick Up Option: 1. Come to City Hall and pay \$25 fee (receive bulk pick-up date)  
2. Provide address of bulk item  
3. Place bulk item 4 ft from curb/street and any other obstacle.

\*Note: If an excessive number of bulk items need to be picked up, additional charges may apply.

Free Drop Off Option: Residents may take bulk items to a designated dumpster at the public works department located at 148 Copeland Street between the hours of 7:30-3:30 Monday – Friday.

Any bulk item placed on the side of the road without following these steps is illegal dumping and can result in a \$100 fine.

NOTE REGARDING TRASH CANS: Trash cans containing household trash are required to be removed from the right of way, street, curb or sidewalk and returned to the dwelling after pick up each week.

Components of this policy are subject to change as the process is evaluated. Residents should check [baxley.org](http://baxley.org) for notices concerning changes to the policy.
